Hey Josh!

After reviewing the co-curricular budget with James Zavas, SBCC Controller, I realized that the 60/40 split with the ASG is not sustainable if we are going to maintain our same level of programming in the Office of Student Life.

We are estimating a maximum of \$80,000 in co-curricular income this year. This would leave us \$48,000 for events. We are estimating a minimum of \$71,500 is spending on events on for the 2017-2018 academic year.

This leads me to your ASG's original proposal of the implementation of a \$4 increase for 2018-2019 academic year. If we were to do this Student Government would need to put forth a 2017-2018 referendum with details of the increase spelled out completely.

The language would read something like:

"There is currently a \$5 opt-out student activity fee. In order to increase programming for student clubs, events and initiatives we are proposing an increase of this opt-out fee from \$5 to \$9. Vote "Yes" if you are in support of raising the Student Activity Fee from \$5 to \$9.

Please review the idea of a new referendum with your board and let me know what you think.
