We, the undersigned, wish to voice our opposition to the TLU limits imposed by AP 7210. We believe it is a solution to a problem that does not exist. We believe that the TLU limits reflected in AP 7210 should be revised upward and that faculty, departments, and chairs should be the primary entities judging which courses should be taught by whom, in what quantity and frequency, and in what semester or summer session. Should it not be possible to recalibrate the relationship between faculty and the administration to reflect the priority of faculty, chairs and departments to make those decisions, we feel that this segment of the AP should indeed be rescinded.
